Bell-ringers sought to mark the Platinum Jubilee


Budding bell-ringers are being sought to help ring in the Queen's Platinum Jubilee later this year, with free lessons on offer every Saturday morning.

KLFC had originally planned to walk in support of Druglink in 2020, however due to Covid had not been able to make good on this until now.

After a refreshment stop at the 12 mile mark the group were met by some friends from Harrow Borough FC, and they walked the last three miles together.



Greg Lee, Supporters Liaison Officer at KLFC, said: 'I personally would like to thank all of the walkers, the supporters from both KLFC and Harrow and the players and Management from KLFC for all the support and being so generous with donations. The cherry on the top is that Kings came out 1–0 winners from the game, a crucial three points for us.'

Food Bank appeal

Food banks in and around Kings Langley are appealing for donations as supplies begin to run low.

Organisers of foodbanks at both All Saints and St Benedicts in Bennetts End are asking members of the community to donate non-perishable items such as tinned and dried foods, tea and coffee, UHT milk and basic toiletries.

The banks continue to be well patronised but rely on the generosity of the public to ensure those members of society in need can be looked after. Both churches take donations directly, but also accept items at Dunelm in Apsley and St Mary's Church opposite Sainsburys.

Parking solution 'a priority' at KLFC

Kings Langley Football Club is planning to carry out a survey of supporters to gain a better understanding of their transport needs as the problem of match day parking rumbles on.

The tale, authored by brothers George


and Weedon Grossmith, features just four characters.

The beautiful village parish church of All Saints is a grade II* listed building; there has been a church on the site since at least 1299 when Edward I worshipped there, and it houses the historic tomb of the first Duke of York.

The age and listing of the building means that constraints when dealing with repairs often demand expensive materials and labour-intensive methods. All of this means a weighty responsibility for the church organisation to afford.

The Friends of All Saints is a non-religious village community group working independently of the church to raise money to maintain and preserve the fabric of this historic building. Today, they join the hundreds of people who have been maintaining this sacred building through time for the generations ahead.

The Friends organise fundraising events and invite donations either in the form of one-off gifts or regular giving by standing order. Donations have helped fund repairs to the nave floor, a new heating system, emergency roof repairs, and disabled toilet facilities.

Anyone who would like to offer their support can do so by becoming a regular Friend, or by making flexible donations or simply a one-off small amount. Every donation is important

to the group, whatever the amount, and will help to secure the future of the All Saints church building.

News from the Parish Pump

This financial year there have been some continuing themes such as the Council's Neighbourhood Plan, and the three Parish Plan working groups looking at environmental, leisure and transport issues.

Their projects include an environmental award for innovation, solar panels for the parish offices and possible transport improvements for the High St pinch point and Vicarage Lane junction; there are also plans for a school crossing patrol on Hempstead Rd, Leisure works include clearing 1,000 metres of woodland paths, Kings Langley Links, a community toilet scheme, the installation of signage/maps in the village, and a trim trail in Green Park.

Unsurprisingly a great deal of the Council's work is around the village, responding to problems such as flooding at Sunderland's Yard allotments, support for community projects such as the toilet block mural and providing bee boxes at the primary school, as well as proactively organising the monthly community gardening, council surgeries, litter picks and hybrid public meetings ie. ensuring they are accessible in person and online.

In addition, grants were made to local groups including the cricket club, the cycle club and Waterways Experience – and *Kings Langley Village News!* The Council have also been working jointly with our neighbours in Abbots Langley to fund a Repair Shed.

Finally, the Council's Village Garden provided an oasis for individuals, groups and families, and the continuing investment in the trees, plants and shrubs – and resurfaced footpath – has been 'repaid' a thousandfold.

However, it's not all work, with the return of the Carnival, the Gardens competition and Christmas Lights competitions (and the Christmas Lights!) and, of course, the human sundial on the Common. The forthcoming year looks just as busy for our Councillors.

Christian Aid plans fundraising drive

Christian Aid is preparing to launch its dedicated fundraising week that last year saw thousands of pounds raised around the village.

From 15 –21 May this year volunteers will be conducting house-to-house envelope collections in which donations are made to make a real difference where it is most needed.

Last year Christian Aid raised £4,583 through its envelope donation scheme and organisers expressed gratitude for the kindness shown and the generosity of those who contributed.

For the first time in a generation, global poverty is rising. Covid-19, conflict and the climate crisis are pushing more of our neighbours into a struggle for survival.

Members of the community are also very welcome at the United Service at All Saints Church at 9.30am on 22 May in which the congregation reflects on the week that has gone and give thanks for all that has been achieved.

Christian Aid works in 50 countries around the world supporting vulnerable people with emergency aid and long-term development through partners on the ground. They help people regardless of religion, ethnic origin, or sex.

Cricket Club is back on track

Kings Langley's Cricket Club is celebrating after hitting its fundraising target of £20,000 for new outdoor nets.

The appeal for donations ran for just over three months and in early February it was reported that, thanks to 132 generous supporters, the ambitious sum had been met.

Refurbishment of the net facilities began back in March 2020 after careful financial planning and fundraising forecasting meant the club's committee was confident the required target could be met.

However, just two days into the project Covid-19 meant all work had to stop – but not before the existing net surface had been removed.

The impact of the pandemic went on to have a catastrophic effect on the club's fundraising, with revenue from the bar and private events lost, and planned events cancelled.

But now, as the club approaches its 200th anniversary in 2030, they are back on track to offer the high-quality training facilities that the committee is so keen to establish.



A note from your Dacorum Borough Councillors

It's been some time since we last wrote, but the focus during the pandemic has rather obviously been on providing the essential local public services on which people rely.

To that end, we pay tribute to the fabulous effort all Dacorum Borough Council staff have put in; for example the bin emptying folk, who have kept working extremely hard all through the pandemic – particularly as domestic refuse has increased by a third as people work from home.

The Dacorum Local Plan guiding local development to 2038 remains paused whilst we wait for emerging government legislation, the effects of the pandemic and the outcome of our lobbying to get our ridiculous house building target reduced. Meanwhile, the council has been carrying out the extensive homework that will be required if our house building target is not reduced, and we are to try and get our Local Plan approved with a lower amount of housing.

Contrary to long-running complaints from political opponents, the council has set up a public space public order covering the whole Borough to tackle the twin scourges of littering and dog fouling. We've commissioned an enforcement partner, which has allowed us to tackle these problems effectively (see opposite).

The council has also been able to continue using a loop-hole in housing finance legislation to build new council houses, with the ten houses nearing completion at the top of Coniston Road being the first council houses to be built in Kings Langley since the 1970s.


